10. LIST IN NARRATIVE ALL RELATED CASE NUMBERS IF MULTIPLE CLEAR-UP.

On 8/2/2010 I was dispatched to an animal complaint at the Quail Run Community Dog Park located at the corner of Severn Tree Blvd and New Disney Road, Severn, Anne Arundel County, Maryland. An off-duty Federal Police Officer had called in that he had just shot a "Husky" dog which attacked his dog. Upon arrival I observed a light colored "Husky" dog on the ground in the middle of the fenced in dog park. I observed that the dog had what appeared to be one gunshot wound to his right rear abdomen area. I observed a small amount of blood on the ground next to where he was laying. Sergeant T.J. Smith #1368 had arrived on the scene moments before my arrival. Sgt. Smith pointed out the off-duty Federal Police Officer identified as [REDACTED]. Sgt. Smith had already notified dispatch to have Animal Control respond to assist the wounded dog. There were no other witnesses on the scene.

I spoke with [REDACTED] who advised that he and his wife [REDACTED] arrived to the dog park with their German Sheperd named "Asia" on a leash. He advised that they entered the dog park and encountered a "Husky" dog off the leash with a male subject. [REDACTED] advised that the "Husky" came over and started to sniff his dog and everything seemed to be ok. He then advised that the "Husky" started to jump on "Asia" and become aggressive. [REDACTED] yelled over to the male subject with the dog. The subject was later identified as Stephen Ryan Kurinij. [REDACTED] advised that he was yelling loudly for Kurinij to get his dog. [REDACTED] was trying to pull her dog back on the leash to get the "Husky" off her dog. [REDACTED] advised that the "Husky" started to grit his teeth and bite his dog around the neck. He advised that he tried to reach and get the "Husky" off his dog. The dog turned and attempted to bite him. The "Husky" then started to bite his dog again. [REDACTED] advised that he was in fear for himself, his wife and his dog. He pulled out his off-duty pistol and shot the "Husky" one time in the right rear side. The dog ran over and layed down on the ground. [REDACTED] advised that Kurinij just stood there and appeared to be "out of it". [REDACTED] advised that he then called police. [REDACTED] did not advise that his dog was injured and it appeared to be ok. I photographed his dog as well as the dog park area and the rules sign. The weapon was a Glock 17 9mm serial [REDACTED]. The round of ammunition was "Hydroshock". There were no other people in the area of the discharge of the weapon and there was a proper backstop. The area was canvassed for the spent shell casing with negative results. [REDACTED] advised that he contacted his police supervisor reference to discharging his weapon.

I observed a male, later identified as Stephen Ryan Kurinij, standing near the dog. Kurinij advised that the dog was named "Bear" and he had been in the dog park and that "Bear" was running off leash inside the park. He advised that he observed [REDACTED] and his wife, later identified as [REDACTED] arrive at the park walking a German Sheppard on the leash. He advised that "Bear" is a friendly dog and has never had any problems at the dog park. He advised that "Bear" and "Asia" seemed to be getting along. He advised that "Asia" started pulling [REDACTED] towards "Bear" and she appeared scared. Kurinij advised that he didn't know what was going on and next thing he knew "Bear" was on the ground. [REDACTED] I started questioning him further and realized that "Bear" was not his dog. I asked him who the dog belonged to and he advised his brother-in law, Ryan Keegan Rettaliata. I asked him to go notify Rettaliata to respond to the dog park. A few minutes later Rettaliata arrived at the dog park and came running over towards Sgt. Smith and me. He was very irate and aggressive towards us. He screamed, "Which one of you cops shot my dog?" He assumed that Sgt Smith had shot his dog and continued to be aggressive and at one point squared off and appeared that he was going to strike Sgt Smith. Once calmed down Rettaliata went over to his dog and was getting directions from Animal Control Officers on

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the scene. Animal Control Officers Dowd and Fabrizi assisted Rettaliata and put "Bear" on a stretcher and carried him over to his Jeep. Rettaliata then transported "Bear" to the Anne Arundel Veterinary Emergency Clinic, 808 Bestgate Road, Annapolis, Maryland. (410) 224-0331. I called the Vet Clinic and spoke with Rettaliata on the phone and provided him with [REDACTED] name and the police case number. He advised that "Bear" was still alive and he was trying to decide if he can afford the emergency surgery that his dog needed. He apologized for his behavior when he first arrived at the dog park. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Rettaliata was upset that his dog was shot and wanted to know if [REDACTED] could legally have the weapon. I explained to him that he is allowed to carry a weapon due to the fact that he is a Federal Police Officer. He wanted to know what department he worked for and I provided him the name and phone number of the agency.

The dog run has a sign posting "Dog Run Rules" which state the following: #2 To help prevent dog fights, owners are encouraged to inquire about and dogs already in the run which are unfamiliar to them, prior to entering the run. Observing dog's body language is also recommended. #3 No dogs known to be aggressive towards other dogs or people (or exhibiting and threatening behavior) may enter the run.

Sgt. Smith contacted Lieutenant Roach #1130 and Night Commander Jordan was notified. I contacted the Department of Defense Police Department Watch Commander. I spoke with Lieutenant Lorenz and confirmed that [REDACTED] was an officer in good standing and was able to carrying a weapon off-duty. I provided her with our police department report number and my contact information.

On 8/3/10 at approximately 0015 hours responded to the Anne Arundel Veterinary Emergency Clinic and spoke with employees who advised that "Bear" had died during surgery at approximately 2130 hours. Veterinary Doctor Tasha Fleury had performed the surgery and recovered the spent bullet projectile from the deceased dog. The Doctor advised that the dog had only one entrance wound and there was no exit wound in the dog. I recovered the bullet as evidence. I responded to Western District and submitted the bullet to Property Management. This case is closed.
